(Rainy day location - John Jay Middle School)

STAFF

The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp Program is run under the direction of a trained staff of professionals and counselors. Our Main Event Camp Director is Bill Yurus. Bill is in his eighth year as Director and before that he was our Assistant Director for six years. He began at the Main Event camp as our Sports and Games specialist which is a position he held for 15 years. Currently, Bill is a teacher at a private high school in the city. Our Assistant Director, Linley Pullem, joins us for her seventh year in this position and her seventeenth year at the camp. Linley was our Arts and Crafts Specialist prior to this and has been with the Main Event Camp as a CIT and Counselor as well. Linley is a high school history teacher at Saint Raphael's Academy in Rhode Island.

Our Aquatics Director is Valerie Kaplan. This is Valerie's first year as the aquatics director and she has approximately 5 years of aquatic experience. Valerie holds the following aquatic certifications: CPR for the Professional Rescuer, First Aid and Lifeguard Training, Lifeguard Management and Water Safety Instructor. Valerie will oversee a staff of 13 camp lifeguards/instructors.

The Town of Lewisboro works cooperatively with the Katonah-Lewisboro School District who provides all transportation to and from camp under supervision of our transportation coordinator Annie Heffernan. This is her fifth year at the helm of transportation and she has been working with the camps for the past sixteen years.

Our specialists have experience in their area of specialty as well as working with children. In addition, all of our counselors are a minimum 16 years old or over. Most have some experience in working with children and are required to attend a mandatory staff training program as mandated by Westchester County and New York State Board of Health. Once again we will be utilizing Counselors in Training (C.I.T.'s are 15 years old) in our camp to work with assigned specialists, counselors and groups.

Under New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations, we must have one staff member per 200 campers certified in American Red Cross Responding to Emergencies First

Aid and one staff member per 200 campers certified in CPR for the Professional Rescuer. The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp exceeds these requirements.

PERMIT

The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp Program:

- 1) Must have a permit to operate from the Westchester County Health Department
- 2) Is required to be inspected twice yearly

Inspection reports and required camp written safety, medical, and fire safety plans are on file at the Westchester County Health Department, Bureau of Public Health Protection, Mt. Kisco, NY and are available for your review.

RAINY DAY/THUNDERSTORM PROCEDURES

In the event of rainy days or thunderstorms, the Main Event campers must follow the procedure outlined below which is the approved plan for the Lewisboro Day Camp program at Town Park as mandated by the Westchester County Board of Health. The procedure is designed to ensure a safe environment for all.

The rainy day site for the Main Event Camp is John Jay Middle School. It is important to remember that if you drop your child off at Town Park in the morning; pick up is at Town Park in the afternoon regardless of the weather. If you drop your child off at John Jay Middle School in the morning, pick up is at John Jay Middle School in the afternoon regardless of the weather.

1. If it is raining and/or lightening and thundering in the morning prior to camp, PARENTS ARE REQUESTED TO CALL 232-6166 (RECREATION PROGRAM HOTLINE) 763-9274 (DAY CAMP OFFICE) OR PLEASE CHECK OUR WEBSITE AT WWW.LEWISBOROGOV.COM AT PARKS AND RECREATION UNDER "PROGRAM UPDATES" OR YOU CAN FRIEND US ON FACEBOOK AT LEWISBORO PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT OR IF YOU SIGNED UP FOR OUR EMAIL BLAST WE WILL EMAIL YOU DIRECTLY.
2. In the event of rain/thunderstorm/inclement weather at Town Park in the afternoon, (after 1:30 pm), campers will remain at Town Park and 3:00 pm pick-up will be at Town Park. If it is only raining, pick-up procedure will follow what is outlined in the Arrival/Departure procedures.

IN THE EVENT OF A THUNDERSTORM AT TOWN PARK DURING DISMISSAL TIME, THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE MUST BE IMPLEMENTED AS MANDATED BY THE WESTCHESTER COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH AND AS OUTLINED IN THE LEWISBORO DAY CAMP SAFETY PLAN:

- Parents are strongly encouraged to pick up their child prior to dismissal time/prior to the thunderstorm if there are signs/warnings/news reports of an approaching thunderstorm.

- If parents cannot pick up their child early, parents are strongly encouraged to wait until the storm passes and then pick up their child. Staff will remain with the campers until campers are picked up.

- If parents pick-up their child while it is still lightening or thundering, parents **MUST** park their car in the designated parking area and get out and retrieve their child from the designated meeting area as indicated below:

**POOL BATH HOUSE/TENT – 3rd and 4th GRADE BOYS & GIRLS
PAVILION - 5th - 7th GRADE BOYS & GIRLS**

AS PER WESTCHESTER COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH INSTRUCTIONS, CAMP STAFF CAN NOT ESCORT CAMPERS TO CARS DURING A THUNDERSTORM.

NOTE: AFTER HOURS CAMPERS RAINY DAY LOCATION IS CYRUS RUSSELL COMMUNITY HOUSE ON ROUTE 35 IN CROSS RIVER. AFTER HOURS CAMPERS WILL BE TRANSPORTED TO CYRUS RUSSELL COMMUNITY HOUSE AFTER REGULAR PICK-UP HAS ENDED AND PARENTS SHOULD PICK UP AT CYRUS RUSSELL COMMUNITY HOUSE (763-3915).

Any changes in the camp day or schedule will be put on the program hotline at 232-6166, our website, email blasted out and on Facebook.

MEDICAL FORMS

New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations require that all children attending private or public day, travel, or sleep away camps must have their medical history on file **BEFORE** they may start camp. If your form is not on file prior to the start of camp, your child will not be admitted into camp until the form is complete. If your child is required to take any type of medication during camp hours, a Medical Authorization Form **MUST** be filled out by the parent **AND** physician, and handed in with the medication the first day your child attends camp. This includes inhalers that may only be needed on an as needed basis. Medication will be left with the camp's health director who will oversee and supervise the child in self-administering their own medication. By law, camp personnel cannot dispense internal medications to the child unless they are a NYS licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant or registered nurse. Written permission can be given by both the physician and parent to allow the camper to carry medication that is needed for emergency purposes (i.e.; epi-pen; asthma inhaler).

SWIMMING

Main Event campers will receive instructional swim lessons, which follow the Red Cross guidelines by our Aquatics Director and swim staff. Main Event campers will be tested the first week of camp to determine their level of competency. They will then be placed into groups according to their ability within their grade group. Late entering campers will be tested prior to their first swim session.

Under New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations, all non-swimmers must be readily identifiable. The Town of Lewisboro Day Campers will be using neon wristbands to identify our non-swimmers. Wristbands will be given to each non-swimmer at the beginning of their swim time and collected at the conclusion of their swim time. In addition, our campers who are classified as swimmers will be wearing different neon colored wristbands. This has been added as an extra level of safety to ensure that a non-swimmer cannot take off their wristband and proceed to a swimmer area (which formerly did not use wristbands). Therefore, all campers must wear a wristband in order to swim. Any swimming concerns/notes should be sent in writing to your child's counselor. The note should be placed in an envelope and marked on the outside: Attention, Valerie Kaplan our Aquatics Director.

SWIM ATTIRE/GEAR

Campers should wear their bathing suit under their clothing and bring their change of clothes in their bag/knapsack to change into after their swim time on their regularly scheduled swim days. This will alleviate the need for two complete changes which is extremely helpful, particularly with our younger campers. **On days that your child is not scheduled to swim, bathing suit and towel should be sent as they may be using sprinklers, particularly on hot days.** The following items are necessary for swim time: bathing suit, towel, sunscreen, and hair ties (for children with long hair). The following items are optional: goggles, bathing cap, brush/combs, and ear plugs/wax.

All towels, clothes, lunch boxes/bags should be clearly labeled with your child's name to prevent their valuables from ending up in the lost and found.

We suggest you apply sunscreen to your child prior to going to camp each day and send sunscreen with your child to camp. Counselors will be asked to remind their campers to apply sunscreen throughout the day and will assist younger campers who need help applying it if written permission is given to the camp.

RELEASE FORM

When you registered your child for camp, the release form you signed indicates that your child(ren) will participate in regularly scheduled camp activities (i.e.; arts & crafts, swimming), special events (i.e.; water carnival, moon bounce) and off-site trips. If there is an activity you do not wish your

child to participate in, you should notify the Camp Director, Bill Yurus, in writing.

TRIPS/SPECIAL EVENTS

Main Event campers are scheduled to go on trips to various amusement areas. Special event entertainment will be brought into camp as part of their camp program. **ALL CAMPERS WHO ATTEND A TRIP MUST WEAR THEIR BLUE CAMP SHIRT!!** Due to the strict camper to counselor ratios mandated by both the state and county health departments, we cannot allow campers who do not attend trips to stay back at camp; therefore, there is no camp for those children not attending trips.

LATE ARRIVALS/EARLY DEPARTURES

Daily attendance will be taken at camp. If you arrive late in the morning or pick up your camper before regular dismissal time, you must sign your camper in/out at the Day Camp office. The Day Camp Office at Town Park is located under the pavilion. If you will be picking your camper up early, you **MUST** send a note with your camper to give to his/her counselor. **PLEASE INCLUDE YOUR CHILD'S FULL NAME, GROUP, DAY, DATE, and TIME you will be picking up your camper.**

NOTES

For the safety of your camper, written parental permission (note) must be sent for the following:

- **If your camper is to leave camp with a friend, neighbor, relative, or someone other than their usual ride. Also, if your child is ill, it is not necessary to call him/her in sick.**

If no note is received by your child's counselor, your child will not be released. For car pools or arrangements that will last for the summer, one note specifying days and persons picking up/dropping off your camper will be kept on file for the summer. Each parent within the car pool must send a note specifying the above. If something changes in your car pool, a new note must be sent. **Notes should specify your camper's name, group, and counselor as well as the other pertinent information.**

CAMP PICTURES

Camp pictures will be taken on Thursday the 21st of July. **Please have your camper wear their BLUE camp shirt.** More detailed instructions will be sent home with your camper as the date gets closer.

END OF CAMP DAY

No child may remain at the pool or camp site unless they are enrolled in the After Hours program. Please be sure to check your child's bag/knapsack daily for any camp memos or projects that may be coming home with your child.

LATE PARENTS

Parents are expected to be at the camp site promptly at the dismissal time. If a parent will be late, please call and notify the camp director and try to have a neighbor/friend pick up your child. We realize there are sometimes unforeseen circumstances; however, **repeated lateness will not be tolerated. In order to compensate camp staff, who need to remain after camp beyond the time stated in their contract, a \$20 fee will be charged each time a staff member must remain at camp with a camper whose parent is continually late (more than twice).**

CLOTHING

Campers should come to camp as comfortable as possible. Shorts, short sleeve shirts, and sneakers should be worn. Sandals are **NOT** recommended. Rain coats and rain gear should be worn in rainy weather. Swimsuits and towels should be brought daily.

LUNCH AND DRINK

All full day campers should bring their lunch and drink each day. In addition, you may want to send a separate snack and drink. Lunch boxes or insulated lunch bags with a freezer pack should be used. To ensure a cold drink, you may want to freeze your child's juice box overnight and allow it to thaw during the day. There is no refrigeration at the Main Event Camp; therefore, lunches should contain non-perishable foods. Limited refrigeration is available for medications, etc. **Please, no glass containers!**

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

We ask that parents do not allow their children to bring their own personal belongings to camp (i.e.; toys, iPods, MP3 players, books, etc.). We cannot be responsible for their safe keeping and it sometimes causes friction within the groups particularly with our younger campers.

LEWISBORO DAY CAMP TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Bus transportation is once again offered this camp season from specific areas within Lewisboro. The transportation program is outlined below. Please read all the information carefully as it is very important that the following procedures be adhered to in order to insure the safety of all involved.



BUSES

If your child is registered for bus transportation, below you will find the morning and afternoon drop off/pick up schedule. Please be advised these times are approximate and unforeseen traffic, road construction, weather, etc. may cause an occasional delay.

NOTE: (1) DUE TO THE LARGE NUMBER OF BUS RIDERS AND THE MAXIMUM BUS CAPACITY, WE ASK THAT BUS TRANSPORTATION BE USED ON A REGULAR BASIS AND THAT YOU PRE-REGISTER FOR THIS SERVICE.

(2) WE CANNOT ACCOMMODATE GUESTS ON YOUR CHILD'S BUS. THEREFORE, IF YOUR CHILD IS BRINGING A FRIEND HOME FROM CAMP AND THE OTHER CHILD IS NOT A BUS

RIDER, BOTH CHILDREN MUST BE PICKED UP AT THE CAMP SITE.

(3) THERE IS NO TRANSPORTATION FOR THE AFTER HOURS PROGRAM. CAMPERS MUST BE PICKED UP AT TOWN PARK OR CYRUS RUSSELL AT THE END OF THE DAY. (4) BUS TRANSPORTATION IS A PRIVILEGE AND CAN BE REVOKED AT ANY TIME DUE TO UNRULY BEHAVIOR.

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE PROCEDURES AT THE CAMPSITE

The arrival and departure procedure at each campsite is of utmost importance. We ask that at both facilities you follow the flow of traffic and the instructions of the traffic coordinator(s). Parking should only be in designated parking areas and for the safety of the campers, please do not pass while on line.

BUS STOPS

It is the parent's responsibility to be at the bus stop to pick up their child. A written note from the parent must be turned in to the bus driver if the child is allowed to walk home from the bus stop, is to be picked up by someone other than their parent, or if the child will not be taking the bus home on a particular day. If a parent is going to be delayed, he/she must notify the camp director and have someone at the bus stop to pick up their camper. **We cannot leave a child unattended. If, after 5 minutes of waiting, your child is not picked up, he/she will be brought to the After Hours program where the parent is expected to pick up the camper.** Although we understand there are extenuating circumstances, repeated lateness will not be tolerated. At times, two to three buses may be arriving at a bus stop at one time. In order to assure that all campers are unloaded safely and to account for the children at all times, the parent or authorized guardian must approach the bus door to retrieve their child at which time your child will be let off the bus.

BUS RULES

Bus rules are implemented for the safety of your children. Our bus drivers are committed to safely transporting your child to his/her destination. We encourage you to go over these rules with your child. Bus transportation is a privilege and can be revoked at any time due to misconduct during transport.

- No sticking any part of the body out of the windows
- No throwing objects in or around the bus or out of the bus
- No shouting from or in the bus
- No standing in or moving through the aisles of the bus
- Campers and staff must remain seated until the bus has come to a complete stop
- No rough housing on the bus
- No speaking to, calling to, or signaling to passing motorists or other persons outside the bus
- No gum chewing at any time on the bus
- No eating or drinking on the bus



The Lewisboro Day Camp, Camp Operator or Recreation Staff has attended all trips listed below and are not deemed high risk trips.

Friday, July 1st – Bounce - Poughkeepsie, NY

Bounce offers fun physical activities for every age. Aside from free jumping and performing tricks such as forward and backward flips and twists, by far the most popular activities are trampoline dodgeball and slam dunk basketball. Bounce also houses a foam pit jump, an arcade, snack bar and lounge and a state-of-the-art sound system. **You must bring lunch.**

Wednesday, July 6th– Lake Compounce - Bristol, CT

Enjoy a full day of unlimited rides at this fun amusement park. **You must buy lunch in the park.** Bring swim attire, there are water rides. You may want to bring extra money for snacks, games and souvenirs. **PLEASE NOTE THAT: This trip will return late, so pickup is at 5:00 p.m.**

Wednesday, July 13th – My Three Sons – Cathy’s Castle, Norwalk, CT

Campers will have the opportunity to play Laser Tag, in the Laser Maze, the Balladium, and play a variety of other arcade games. **Food will be available for purchase or campers can bring their lunch.**

Wednesday, July 20th– Splashdown - Fishkill, NY

Splashdown is a water themed park, with attractions for campers of all ages and swimmers of all levels. The campers will enjoy a variety of waterslides along with other games available for the camper’s enjoyment. **Food is available for purchase (anticipate long waits) or campers can bring their lunch.**

Friday, July 22nd – Monster Mini Golf - Danbury, CT – 3rd and 4th grade only

A monster themed indoor glow in the dark mini golf facility. Complete with 18 holes of eye popping excitement. A 2300 sq. ft. cosmic themed Laser Tag Arena Fog Music to keep the excitement going. Campers will win prizes from mad scientists while out on the course. Dance contest, trivia, golf challenges, add to the excitement of the trip. It will leave campers screaming for

more. **Please bring a lunch.**

Tuesday, July 26th – Playland - Rye, NY

This outdoor amusement park has lots of rides to offer every age group especially the world famous Dragon Coaster. Each camper will get a wristband with unlimited rides. Campers should bring extra money for the game stands if they intend on playing. Concession stands are available. **Bring or buy lunch.**

Thursday, July 28th – Grand Prix – Mt. Kisco, NY

A favorite local attraction where campers can enjoy the day racing go karts, bowling and playing games at the arcade. **Campers must bring a lunch.**

Friday, July 29th – Lake Welch Beach – Stony Point, NY - 5th - 7th only

Is a half-mile-long sandy beach in the wooded hills of the Ramapo Mountains; it is the largest beach in Harriman State Park. The park offers cool breezes, swimming, fishing and boating. **You can bring lunch with you or buy at the park.**
